Derby Historical Society event marks end of Christmas season

ANSONIA - The Derby Historical Society's annual "Twelfth Night" party last week at the Gen. David Humphreys House offered visitors a glimpse at how people celebrated in a simpler time.

The historical society is headquartered in the circa 1698 house at 37 Elm St.,

Humphreys' birthplace.

Humphreys was a Revolutionary War hero who served as aide-de-camp to Gen. George Washington and later became ambassador to Spain and Portugal.

He brought Merino sheep from Spain back to America and started a successful woolen mill in Humphreysville, in what is now Seymour.

Daniel Bosques, Derby Historical Society Executive Director, was pleased with the turnout.

He said, "We received \$500 in donations and welcomed more than 150 guests."
